Tuesday - Medical Speakers



ROGER D. SEHEULT, MD

Dr. Seheult graduated from Loma Linda University School of Medicine in 2000. He completed residency and fellowship training in Internal Medicine, Pulmonary Diseases, and Critical Care Medicine in 2007. He has faculty appointments at LLU School of Medicine, LLU School of Allied Health – Physician Assistant Program, and University of California, Riverside School of Medicine. He is boarded in Internal Medicine, Pulmonary Diseases, Critical Care Medicine, and Sleep Medicine. Previously, he served as the Medical Director for intensive care services at the San Gorgonio Memorial Hospital in Banning, California, and a sleep laboratory in the Inland Empire. He currently practices at Beaver Medical Group, and is the co-founder of MedCram.com, an online medical education company.

"Sleep and the American Culture: What to Do?" | 9:00 am - 10:30 am
We as Americans are not sleeping well. This course will delve into the external pressures innate in our culture and identify steps to consciously mend and allow sleep to happen.

Dr. Wilson graduated from Loma Linda University School of Medicine in 2006. She completed a family medicine internship and then a residency in preventive medicine, with a clinical focus on lifestyle medicine. Her initial work was with medical student education in motivational interviewing, whole person care, clinical primary care, and lifestyle medicine. In 2016, she became the program director of the LLUH Preventive Medicine Residency Program. With her team, she initiated a novel inpatient Lifestyle Medicine service line and a Lifestyle Medicine Fellowship program. In 2018, she was appointed Chair of the Preventive Medicine Department at LLUH. She enjoys public speaking in the Loma Linda area, as well as nationally and internationally regarding the innovations around Lifestyle Medicine at LLUH.

"Motivational Interviewing - The Art of Helping Your Patient Decide They Want to Make the Healthy Choice" | 10:45 am - 12:15 pm

Motivational interviewing is a powerful technique to help your patients move away from the status quo and tap into their own desires for healthy change. We will discuss the stages of change, practice stage-matched messaging, and utilize language that reduces resistance and creates forward momentum.

Tuesday - Dental Speaker



HEIDI B. KOHLTFARBER, DDS, MS, PhD

Dr. Kohltfarber is the owner and managing oral and maxillofacial radiologist for Dental Radiology Diagnostics and a Dentsply Sirona 3D trainer. In addition, she is an adjunct professor in the Department of Diagnostic Sciences at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She received her DDS degree from Loma Linda University in 2003 and in 2012 she received her master's degree in Oral and Maxillofacial Radiology from UNC-Chapel Hill. Her master's research compared 2D versus 3D radiography in the treatment planning of root canal treated teeth with apical radiolucencies. In 2017, Dr. Kohltfarber received her PhD in Diagnostic Imaging with an emphasis in craniofacial radiology at King's College London focusing on the Validation and Diagnostic Efficacy of 3D Surface Models in Dentistry: Temporomandibular Joints.

"Cone Beam CT: The Role of 3D Imaging in Dentistry" | 9:00 am - 12:15 pm
Cone beam computed tomography (CBCT) has revolutionized the dental field by allowing
clinicians to visualize the patient in 3D. This technology has increased productivity and efficiency.
In addition, it gives the clinician the opportunity to view more anatomy and pathology than was
previously observed with conventional dental radiographs. This course is designed to help the
dental practitioner better understand 3D imaging as well as what to consider when purchasing
a CBCT for their office. The course is also designed to correlate theappearance of anatomy in
2D and 3D images and help the clinician to understand how to approach and go through
a CBCT volume.

"Cone Beam CT: Pathological Interpretation and Incidental Findings" | 9:00 am - 12:15 pm

Common incidental findings observed with CBCT will be discussed and how to manage them.

MICKEY ASK, MD

Dr. Ask graduated from Loma Linda University School of Medicine in the class of 1979-A. He completed an Internal Medicine residency also at LLU in 1982. He became the medical director of the Clearview Alcohol and Drug Program at the LLU Community Hospital in 1983 and at the same time was working in outpatient Internal Medicine with the LLU group. In 1988 he became the medical director of the Addiction Treatment Program at the Loma Linda Veterans Hospital, initially a 30-bed inpatient program and ultimately an outpatient program where he treated patients with the gamut of substance use issues. He is a Fellow of the American Society of Addiction Medicine and has been involved in all facets of addiction medicine, including the education of medical students studying substance use issues. He retired from the Veterans Hospital in 2016 but continues to chair the LLUMC Physicians Well-Being Committee and work with the recently accredited Addiction Medicine Fellowship program at LLU.

"All You Wanted to Know About Substance Use But Didn't Know to Ask" | 9:00 am - 10:30 am This course will help align our thinking and attitudes to a realistic approach to working with substance users. It will provide the learners with the proper language and definitions to neither under nor over diagnose this condition. Additionally, it will introduce the concepts of stages of change all individuals go through as they progress through any behavior change.

"The Effects of Substance Use on the Family" | 10:45 am – 12:15 pm
During this course we will learn how substance use affects not only the user but also the family.
We will look at genetic data and explore more effective means of helping family members.

Friday - Dental Speakers



HEIDI L. CHRISTENSEN, DDS, MS

Dr. Christensen is Professor and Academic Director of the Division of General Dentistry at Loma Linda University School of Dentistry. She received her DDS degree from LLUSD in 1983. After spending six years in general dentistry, she began clinical teaching at LLUSD in 1992. From 1994 to 1997 she attended the University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio where she received her certificate and master's degree in Dental Diagnostic Sciences. She served as Chair of the Department of Oral Diagnosis, Radiology and Pathology from 2010 to 2015 when the department was merged with the Department of Restorative Dentistry to become the new Division of General Dentistry. During her time at LLUSD, Dr. Christensen has taught radiology, patient assessment and diagnosis, and treatment planning courses to both dental and dental hygiene students. Dr. Christensen currently teaches The Medically Compromised Patient and Practice Management courses to dental students. She also serves on a taskforce that uses current, evidence-based research to update and establish guidelines and protocols for treating the medically compromised patient in the dental setting.



SHELLEY HAYTON, MAT, RDH

Shelley Hayton graduated from Loma Linda University with a bachelor's degree in dental hygiene in 1982. She practiced dental hygiene in general dentistry for 20 years. In 2009 she joined LLU School of Dentistry's faculty in the dental hygiene department as an assistant professor and completed a Master of Arts in Teaching from La Sierra University in 2010. She currently teaches The Medically Compromised Patient and The Special Needs Patient courses for dental hygiene students. She is a member of the LLUSD Interprofessional Education team that establishes learning opportunities for the students in interdisciplinary settings. Shelley works with the dental faculty to obtain current, evidence-based research to update and establish guidelines and protocol for treating medically compromised patients in the dental setting.

"Updates for Keeping Your Patient Safe" | 9:00 am – 12:15 pm

This course will provide an overview of the most recent guidelines and protocol that LLUSD follows when treating the medically compromised patient. Topics will include the most recent updates for antibiotic prophylaxis (including for total joint replacement) and hypertension. Guidelines for treating pregnant patients, patients with diabetes, and patients who are at increased risk for bleeding due to medical conditions, anticoagulant and antiplatelet medications will be presented. The discussion will also include recommendations as to when it is necessary to obtain a medical consult prior to proceeding with dental treatment.


