Big Checks

The Class of 1969 gave scholarships to Jana Nation and Cassandra Pace — each in the amount of \$2,500. This is the second year in a row the Class of 1969 has raised funds to award scholarships to deserving students. This class has raised more than \$115,000 in School of Dentistry funds since they graduated. You can rest assured that although not all present believe the Class of 1969 is the *"hottest dental hygiene graduating class,"* the recipients of these big checks believe they are!

The Class of 1980 appears to be following the example of the Class of 1969. They awarded Kathleen Edson scholarship funds of \$1,000 each to Jacqueline

2010 Alumnus of the Year

Leslie Nazaroff, DrPH, DH '90, was selected as this year's Dental Hygiene Alumnus of the Year. Dr. Nazaroff has played an important part in both dental hygiene and dental student education for nearly 20 years.

Dr. Nazaroff completed her dental hygiene training in 1990, finished her masters in public health in 1994, and received her doctorate in public health in 1998. For most of those years, she was also teaching full-time in the department of periodontics at Loma Linda University School of Dentistry (LLU SD).

A dedicated and enthusiastic teacher, Leslie taught second year dental students the importance of oral health, including the techniques of scaling and root planing. Dental hygiene can thank her that hundreds of dentists value their dental hygienists and the importance of oral health more due her dedicated teaching.

In 2000, Dr. Nazaroff left the School of Dentistry to take a teaching position with San Joaquin Valley College, much closer to her home in Rancho Cucamonga. There she taught courses in basic sciences, local anesthesia and periodontics, and designed their highly effective National Board Review Course. A naturally gifted critical thinker, based in scientific theory and research, Dr. Nazaroff was destined to be an excellent teacher.

Her love for the topics she teaches makes her even more

effective and inspiring as she threads the bond between science and the clinical aspects of hygiene and dentistry. She added her administrative skills when she became the director for the San Joaquin Valley College dental hygiene program in 2007.

The words on the plaque she received fully describe the esteem of her colleagues and peers: *"and we salute her for her devotion to educational pursuits."*

2010 Student of the Year

The Student of the Year Award is given to a student who represents the highest qualities of academic and clinical excellence. Selection is by vote of the faculty. This award is presented each year at the Dental Hygiene/Assisting Alumni Luncheon. A small monetary award accompanies this award.

As she presented the award, Janeen Duff, DH '81, stated, *"This year our student of the year is in the top 1% of her class. Karissa Clark is intellectually curious and is always a consummate professional with her peers, clinical staff, faculty and patients."*

It was noted by many faculty that in every situation Karissa encounters, she is still able to smile and show concern and care for her patients or classmates. She possesses an attitude of openness toward instruction that is refreshing.

Karissa has set a high personal standard in her academic and clinical achievements. She is currently applying to graduate programs in dental hygiene where she will continue her desire for life-long learning after graduation.

TWO-YEAR PROGRAM

The School of Dentistry is planning to open a training program for dental hygienists in Palm Desert.

By the time you receive this newsletter, the Palm Desert Planning Commission will have voted on a conditional use permit for the facility which is to be housed in leased space on Gateway Drive. The permit is required because the site is 4 spaces short of adequate parking.

The program, slated to begin in January 2011, will be offered in a 10,491-square-foot space at 34-280 Gateway Drive. An associate degree in dental hygiene will be offered, with students taking prerequisite science and general education courses at College of the Desert (COD), then transferring to Loma Linda University.

A dental clinic providing care for under-served groups will also be part of the program. *“The need for hygienists is expanding with the aging population,”* Wilkins said to a reporter from the Desert Sun on Monday, April 5. *“We think we can present a really strong program for students to have a health sciences career.”*

Prerequisites for the hygiene program will be similar to the courses required for COD’s nursing program. Students who don’t get into the nursing program will have

another option. The hygiene program will accept 28 students a year for its two-year program. There are several ways you can be involved in this new program.

First, we’re going to need some staff who live in the Coachella Valley area. Second, financial help



will be needed to equip the facility. All donations for the new program qualify for Ivory Society and Dean’s Circle membership. Third, keep the program in mind as you go about your daily professional and personal activities, directing interested individuals to us. This is an exciting new development as we anticipate needs for future dental educational programs in our field.
